Province/Territory	History (Name, Confederation)
	Named "New Scotland" by Sir William Alexander when he was granted the territory (Nova Scotia and PEI) in 1621; Confederation date: 1867
	Named in 1784 in honour of the House of Brunswick, to which the British Royal Family belonged; Confederation date: 1867
	Named from Lake Ontario - Iroquoian word meaning "rocks standing high in water" - probably referring to the Niagara Escarpment; Confederation date: 1867
	"Kebec" is an Algonquian word meaning "where the river narrows"; Confederation date: 1867
	Named from Lake Manitoba, meaning "strait of the spirit (Manitou)". First People thought the sound of the waves were voices of the spirits; Confederation date: 1870
	First named for the land Northwest of Lake Superior; since 1920 it represented the area between the Yukon and Hudson Bay; Confederation date: 1870
	Named as an allusion to Christopher Columbus when mainland colony was established in 1858; Confederation date: 1871
	Named in 1789 in honour of the Duke of Kent, then the commander of the British Troops in North America; Confederation date: 1873
	Amerindian word "Yukunah" meaning "great river"; Confederation date: 1898
	Named in honour of Queen Victoria's daughter, Princess Louise Caroline Alberta in 1883; Confederation date: 1905
	Named from the Saskatchewan River - Cree word meaning "swiftly flowing water"; Confederation date: 1905
	Named by John Cabot in 1497; It became the First English Crown colony in 1583; Confederation date: 1949
	Formerly part of the Northwest Territories until 1999, when it became a separate territory. N ** Answer 30 of the 50 blanks. ** id"; Confederation date: April 1, 1999
